WHERE AND WHEN TO DEPOSIT YOUR PAPER-CARDBOARD AND PMD?

All paper-cardboard and PMD must be deposited:

- **Inside the designated dustbin area (édicule).** The separation of P/C – PMD must be respected inside the waste depots. **Materials must be properly sorted and easily accessible to collectors. If the bins are used improperly, they may not be emptied anymore!** More information may be obtained from your building's management or the town environmental department: **010 43 62 50** or **environnement@olln.be**
- **On the pavement at the side of the road**, where the collection trucks have easy access (the trucks do not collect waste from pedestrianised areas!). **If deposited on the street, then only after 20:00 the evening before the collection or before 06:00 on the day of collection (05:00 during heatwaves).** Never deposit paper cardboard or PMD on a public road except on collection days.

Opening hours applicable all year round:

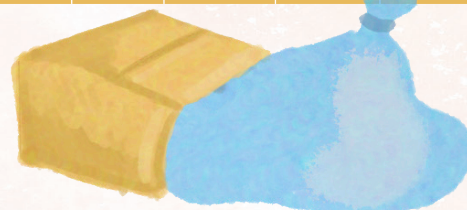
• Monday to Friday 10:00 until 17:00 • Saturday 9:30 until 17:00

Maximum 2m³ per visit and 5m³ per month!

Upon presentation of your student card, you can deposit paper-cardboard, PMD packaging, your transparent glass bottles, flasks and jars, as well as a wide range of other types of waste, including bulk waste, hard plastics, green waste, inert waste, metals, batteries, textiles, wood, electric and electronic equipment, special household waste, frying oils and fats, engine oils, tyres, corks, plaster, asbestos, cement and flat glass.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION: If deposited on the street:

- ✗ Deposit your waste at places where it can be easily seen by the waste collectors;
- ✗ Should your waste not be collected, contact in BW (the inter-municipal agency responsible for the management of waste in Walloon Brabant) the day after the collection at the latest (**0800 49 057** or **valmat@inbw.be**). Any call after that date may not be taken into consideration;
- ✗ In the event of road works, deposit your waste outside the works zone and in a place that is accessible for the trucks;
- ✗ Collections might be postponed if the roads are inaccessible because of black ice or snow;
- ✗ In the event of a heatwave, collections may begin at 05:00 !

If deposited inside the designated dustbin area (édicule):

- ✗ Please respect the colour codes and the spaces set aside for storage. Leaving loose waste in the area is forbidden.

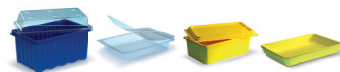

WHAT IS NOT ALLOWED IN THE PMD

- ✗ Packaging made of a combination of materials (e.g. plastic film layer + aluminium film layer) which cannot be separated, like some juice pouches, fruit purée or wet pet food pouches etc.

- ✗ Packaging with child-resistant fastenings

- ✗ Gas cylinders, batteries and elect(ron)ical appliances

- ✗ Packaging featuring one of these pictograms



- ✗ Packaging of motor oil and lubricants, of pesticides, of fuels, of glues, of paints and varnishes, silicone tubes

- ✗ Packaging with a volume of more than 8 liters

- ✗ Polystyrene

- ✗ Other items



WARNING!

Do not put items inside one another or put filled, tied up bags into the PMD bag. Do not hang anything on the outside of the bag.



RULES FOR GOOD RECYCLING

- Empty packaging completely.

- Flatten plastic bottles lengthwise, put the cap on.

- Remove the plastic film from the tray and discard both separately in the bag.

- Remove full body sleeves from the bottle and throw them separately into the blue bag.

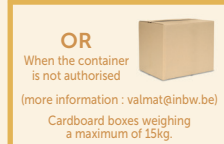


PAPER-CARDBOARD

DOOR-TO-DOOR COLLECTION OR AT THE RECYPARC



Paper bags and cardboard boxes, newspapers, magazines, flyers and pamphlets, books, writing paper and paper for printers.



OR

When the container is not authorised
(more information : valmat@inbw.be)
Cardboard boxes weighing a maximum of 15kg.

Remark:

- Remove any plastic film around publications.

BOTTLES, JARS AND FLASKS IN TRANSPARENT GLASS

PLEASE DISPOSE OF THESE IN THE GLASS BUBBLE



Noncoloured glass

Coloured glass



Remarks:

- Separate coloured glass from non-coloured glass.
- Empty the packaging and remove caps or corks.
- Do not leave any waste near the glass bubble as this is illegal and may result in a fine.



WHAT IS NOT ALLOWED IN THE GLASS BUBBLE



Heat-resistant glass • Porcelain, ceramics and earthenware • Flat glass such as windows, mirrors • Opaline and crystal • Energy-saving light bulbs and fluorescent tubes
